Preface

And I turned to see the voice that spake with me. And being turned, I saw seven golden candlesticks; And in the midst of the seven candlesticks one like unto the Son of man, clothed with a garment down to the foot, and girt about the paps with a golden girdle. His head and his hairs were white like wool, as white as snow; and his eyes were as a flame of fire; And his feet like unto fine brass, as if they burned in a furnace; and his voice as the sound of many waters. And he had in his right hand seven stars: and out of his mouth went a sharp twoedged sword: and his countenance was as the sun shineth in his strength. And when I saw him, I fell at his feet as dead. And he laid his right hand upon me, saying unto me, Fear not; I am the first and the last: I am he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death."

Revelation 2:8 "And unto the angel of the church in Smyrna write; These things saith the first and the last, which was dead, and is alive;"

The First and the Last—Undeniable Proof of Christ's Deity

The title "The First and the Last" is a divine designation attributed to Jehovah God in the Old Testament and later applied to Jesus Christ in the New Testament. This direct parallel demonstrates that Christ is not merely a prophet or an exalted being, but fully and eternally God.

Yahweh Declares Himself the First and the Last

- **Isaiah 41:4** "Who hath wrought and done *it*, calling the generations from the beginning? I the LORD, the first, and with the last; I *am* he."
- **Isaiah 44:6** "Thus saith the LORD the King of Israel, and his redeemer the LORD of hosts; I am the first, and I am the last; and beside me there is no God."

In these passages, God identifies Himself as the eternal source and completion of all things. This title is exclusive to Yahweh, who declares that beside Him there is no God.

Jesus Identified as The First and the Last

- Revelation 1:17-18 "And when I saw him, I fell at his feet as dead. And he laid
 his right hand upon me, saying unto me, Fear not; I am the first and the last: I am
 he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and
 have the keys of hell and of death."
- **Revelation 2:8** "These things saith the first and the last, which was dead, and is alive."

Here, Jesus applies the exact divine title to Himself, making an emphatic claim to His eternal nature and deity. Furthermore, Christ clarifies that He was dead and is alive forevermore, something only He, as the God-Man, could experience.

If **Jehovah alone** is **the First and the Last**, yet Christ applies this title to Himself, then Christ must be **Jehovah in the flesh**.

The Alpha and Omega—Christ's Divine Authority

Another title used exclusively for **God in the Old Testament** and later applied to **Jesus Christ** is "**Alpha and Omega**", signifying **eternal existence and supreme authority over all creation**.

Jehovah Declares Himself Alpha and Omega

- Revelation 1:8 "I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty."

The Alpha and Omega title signifies that God is the originator and consummation of all things, eternally self-existing, and the source of life and judgment.

The God who declared His eternal supremacy in Isaiah is the same Jesus revealed in Revelation. This is not mere symbolism or elevated status—it is absolute proof of His unchangeable nature as God.

Section 2: The Alpha and Omega—The Undeniable Revelation of Christ's Deity

Christ Declares Himself as Alpha and Omega

I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end. I will give unto him that is athirst of the fountain of the water of life freely. He that overcometh shall inherit all things; and I will be his God, and he shall be my son."

1. Christ's Warning to the Churches

Revelation 2:1-5 "Unto the angel of the church of Ephesus write; These things saith he that holdeth the seven stars in his right hand, who walketh in the midst of the seven golden candlesticks; I know thy works, and thy labour, and thy patience, and how thou canst not bear them which are evil: and thou hast tried them which say they are apostles, and are not, and hast found them liars: And hast borne, and hast patience, and for my name's sake hast laboured, and hast not fainted. Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love. Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent."

Revelation 2:12-17 "And to the angel of the church in Pergamos write; These things saith he which hath the sharp sword with two edges; I know thy works, and where thou dwellest, even where Satan's seat is: and thou holdest fast my name, and hast not denied my faith, even in those days wherein Antipas was my faithful martyr, who was slain among you, where Satan dwelleth.But I have a few things against thee, because thou hast there them that hold the doctrine of Balaam, who taught Balac to cast a stumblingblock before the children of Israel, to eat things sacrificed unto idols, and to commit fornication. So hast thou also them that hold the doctrine of the Nicolaitanes, which thing I hate. Repent; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will fight against

them with the sword of my mouth. He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the hidden manna, and will give him a white stone, and in the stone a new name written, which no man knoweth saving he that receiveth it."

Apologetic Truth: Christ speaks with divine authority, warning the churches to repent and return to Him. His words are not mere admonition; they carry the power of judgment—the same sword of the mouth that only Yahweh wields in the Old Testament.

2. Christ's Authority Over Reward and Judgment

Revelation 3:11-13 "Behold, I come quickly: hold that fast which thou hast, that no man take thy crown. Him that overcometh will I make a pillar in the temple of my God, and he shall go no more out: and I will write upon him the name of my God, and the name of the city of my God, which is new Jerusalem, which cometh down out of heaven from my God: and I will write upon him my new name. He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches."

Apologetic Truth: The one who comes quickly is the same one who holds eternal authority to reward the righteous and establish them in His kingdom. This authority is exclusive to God alone.

Revelation 22:12-13 "And, **behold, I come quickly**; and my reward *is* with me, to give every man according as his work shall be. I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, the first and the last."

Apologetic Truth: This verse is unmistakable—Jesus Christ is the Alpha and Omega, the First and the Last, the Sovereign Judge over all creation. The reward and judgment He brings is a function only God can perform.

3. Christ's Final Call and Absolute Identity

Revelation 22:18-21 He which testifieth these things saith, Surely I come quickly. Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus.

"For I testify unto every man that heareth the words of the prophecy of this book, If any man shall add unto these things, God shall add unto him the plagues that are written in this book: And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and *from* the things which are written in this book. He which testifieth these things saith, Surely I

come quickly. Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen."

Apologetic Truth: The one who testifies to the prophecy, the one who is coming quickly, the one who speaks with divine authority, is none other than the Lord Jesus Christ, the Alpha and Omega, the Almighty.

Cross-referencing this with Revelation 1:16-17; 2:16; and 19:15, where Christ wields the sword of His mouth, confirms that He exercises divine judgment, just as Yahweh does throughout Scripture.

Final Conclusion: Christ Is the Sovereign God Who Comes in Glory

The declaration "Behold, I come quickly" reveals the full divine nature of Jesus Christ—He is not merely returning as a messenger, but as the Almighty King, bringing final judgment and eternal redemption.

Jesus Christ is the Alpha and Omega, the Beginning and the End, the One who is, and who was, and who is to come—the Almighty.

Section 4: The Creator—Jesus Christ as the Sovereign Author of All Things

The identity of the Creator is fundamental to understanding the nature and deity of Christ. From Genesis to Revelation, Scripture affirms that there is only one Creator, and this divine work is attributed to both Yahweh in the Old Testament and Jesus Christ in the New Testament.

Isaiah 40:28 "Hast thou not known? hast thou not heard, *that* the everlasting God, the LORD, the Creator of the ends of the earth, fainteth not, neither is weary? *there is* no searching of his understanding."

Apologetic Truth: The Creator is identified explicitly as God Almighty, the LORD, who formed heaven, earth, and man.

2. The New Testament's Revelation of Christ as the Creator

John 1:1-3 "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made."

Colossians 1:16-17 "For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether *they be* thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: **all things were created by him, and for him**: And he is before all things, and by him all things consist."

Hebrews 1:1-3 "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, **by whom also he made the worlds**; Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high:"

Apologetic Truth: The New Testament explicitly reveals that Jesus Christ Himself is The Creator—the same Lord who spoke creation into existence in Genesis is now fully revealed in Christ.

3. The Unshakable Proof That Jesus Is God Almighty

- The Old Testament declares that Yahweh alone is the Creator.
- The New Testament declares that Jesus created all things.
- There cannot be two separate creators—there is only ONE GOD.
- Therefore, Jesus is Yahweh, the Almighty Creator revealed in human flesh.

Final Conclusion: The One who created the heavens, the earth, and all life is none other than Jesus Christ, the full and exact expression of the One True God.

Section 5: The Savior—The Undeniable Revelation of Christ as the Redeemer of Mankind

The title "Savior" belongs exclusively to God in the Old Testament, yet in the New Testament, Jesus Christ is revealed as the Savior of the world. This parallel confirms that the Savior promised throughout history is none other than the Lord Jesus Christ Himself—God Almighty unveiled in human flesh.

- 1. Yahweh Declares Himself as the Only Savior

Look unto me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth: for I *am* God, and *there is* none else."
 - Isaiah 49:26 "And I will feed them that oppress thee with their own flesh; and they shall be drunken with their own blood, as with sweet wine: and all flesh shall know that I the LORD am thy Saviour and thy Redeemer, the mighty One of Jacob."
- Apologetic Truth: Salvation belongs solely to Yahweh. If Jesus Christ is revealed as the Savior, then He must be Yahweh Almighty in human form.
- 2. The New Testament Revelation of Christ as the Savior
- The promised Savior appears in the flesh—Jesus Christ, the Lord:
 - Luke 2:10-11 "And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. 11 For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord."
 - John 3:16-17 "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved."

- 1 Timothy 1:15 "This is a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners; of whom I am chief."
- Titus 3:4-6 "But after that the kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared, Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost; Which he shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour;"
- **Philippians 3:20** "For our conversation is in heaven; from whence also we look for **the Saviour**, **the Lord Jesus Christ**:"
- Titus 2:13 "Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Savior Jesus Christ;"

Apologetic Truth: If The Old Testament declares that Yahweh alone is the Savior, yet The New Testament reveals Jesus Christ as the Savior, then Jesus must be Yahweh fully revealed in flesh.

3. Salvation Was Foretold—Now Fulfilled in Christ

The promise of the Savior was hidden in the Old Testament, yet all prophets believed upon Him and testified of His coming:

- Genesis 3:15 The first prophecy of the Savior's victory over sin and death. "And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel."
- **Isaiah 12:2** "Behold, **God** *is* **my salvation**; I will trust, and not be afraid: for the LORD JEHOVAH *is* my strength and *my* song; he also is become my salvation."
- Luke 19:10 "For the Son of Man is come to seek and to save that which was lost."

Final Conclusion: The Old Testament declares that the Savior is Yahweh, and the New Testament reveals Jesus as that very Savior—therefore, Jesus is Yahweh Almighty, clothed in human flesh to redeem the world.

4. The Mystery of Salvation and Spiritual Discernment

The true identity of Christ as the Savior is a mystery that the natural mind cannot comprehend—only spiritual discernment reveals it:

- 1 Corinthians 2:6-16 "Howbeit we speak wisdom among them that are perfect: yet not the wisdom of this world, nor of the princes of this world, that come to nought: But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, even the hidden wisdom, which God ordained before the world unto our glory: Which none of the princes of this world knew: for had they known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him. But God hath revealed them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God. For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God. Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; comparing spiritual things with spiritual. But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned. But he that is spiritual judgeth all things, yet he himself is judged of no man. For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he may instruct him? but we have the mind of Christ."
- Colossians 2:2-9 "That their hearts might be comforted, being knit together in love, and unto all riches of the full assurance of understanding, to the acknowledgement of the mystery of God, and of the Father, and of Christ; In whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. And this I say, lest any man should beguile you with enticing words. For though I be absent in the flesh, yet am I with you in the spirit, joying and beholding your order, and the stedfastness of your faith in Christ. As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in him: Rooted and built up in him, and established in the faith, as ye have been taught, abounding therein with thanksgiving. Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ. For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily."
- 2 Corinthians 4:1-6 "Therefore seeing we have this ministry, as we have received mercy, we faint not; But have renounced the hidden things of dishonesty, not walking in craftiness, nor handling the word of God deceitfully; but by manifestation of the truth commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God. But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are

lost: In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them. For we preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord; and ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to *give* the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ."

Apologetic Truth: The **natural mind rejects the full identity of Christ** as **God in flesh**, but through **the Holy Spirit**, the **truth is revealed**.

Final Call: Jesus Christ Is the Only Savior

God never gives us a plurality of Saviors—there is only one Savior, and Scripture makes it clear that He is Jesus Christ, the Lord God Almighty.

Final Conclusion: Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of the Savior promised throughout history—God Himself unveiled in human form.

Section 6: Worship Belongs to God Alone—Christ's Full Deity Revealed

Scripture makes two undeniable declarations regarding worship: First, only God is to be worshiped—angels, created beings, and idols must never be worshiped. Second, Jesus Christ is worshiped throughout the New Testament—if He were not God, this would be blasphemy. Through these truths, Christ's deity is fully revealed—He is not merely an exalted being; He is Yahweh, the Almighty, worthy of all worship.

God forbids worship of any other being or false gods. Exodus 34:14 states, "For thou shalt worship no other god: for the LORD, whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God." Deuteronomy 5:6-10 "I am the Lord thy God, which brought thee out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage. Thou shalt have none other gods before me. Thou shalt not make thee any graven image, or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the waters beneath the earth: Thou shalt not bow down thyself unto them, nor serve them: for I the Lord thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of them that hate me, and shewing mercy unto thousands of them that love me and keep my commandments."

Isaiah 42:8 further confirms this: "I am the Lord: that is my name: and my glory will I not give to another, neither my praise to graven images." Zechariah 14:16-17 emphasizes worship being exclusive to Yahweh: "And it shall come to pass, *that* every one that is left of all the nations which came against Jerusalem shall even go up from year to year to worship the King, the LORD of hosts, and to keep the feast of tabernacles. And it shall be, *that* whoso will not come up of *all* the families of the earth unto Jerusalem to worship the King, the LORD of hosts, even upon them shall be no rain." Worship belongs only to Yahweh—He does not share His glory.

Even mighty angels refuse worship, directing all worship to God alone. Revelation 19:10 states, "And I fell at his feet to worship him. And he said unto me, See *thou do it* not: I am thy fellowservant, and of thy brethren that have the testimony of Jesus: worship God: for the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy." Similarly, Revelation 22:8-9 reinforces this truth: "And I John saw these things, and heard *them*. And when I had heard and seen, I fell down to worship before the feet of the angel which shewed me these things. Then saith he unto me, See *thou do it* not: for I am thy fellowservant, and of thy brethren the prophets, and of them which keep the sayings of this book: worship God." Angels, though powerful and holy, are not to be worshiped—only God alone is worthy of worship.

Yet God Himself commands worship of His Son—an act reserved for God alone. Hebrews 1:5-6 states, "For unto which of the angels said he at any time, Thou art my Son, this day have I begotten thee? And again, I will be to him a Father, and he shall be to me a Son? And again, when he bringeth in the first begotten into the world, he saith, And let all the angels of God worship him." If angels must never be worshiped, but God commands angels to worship Jesus, then Jesus must be God.

Jesus receives worship repeatedly in the New Testament. Matthew 2:1-11 records, "Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him. When Herod the king had heard *these things*, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born. And they said unto him, In Bethlehem of Judaea: for thus it is written by the prophet, And thou Bethlehem, *in* the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall rule my people Israel. Then Herod, when he had privily called the wise men, enquired of them diligently what time the star appeared. And he sent them to Bethlehem, and said, Go and search diligently for the young child; and when ye have found *him*, bring me word again, that I may come and worship him also. When they had heard the king, they departed; and, lo, the star, which they saw in the east, went before

them, till it came and stood over where the young child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy. And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him: and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense, and myrrh."

Matthew 14:33 states, "Then they that were in the ship came and worshipped him, saying, Of a truth thou art the Son of God." Matthew 28:9 states, "And as they went to tell his disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, All hail. And they came and held him by the feet, and worshipped him." John 9:38 affirms, "And he said, Lord, I believe. And he worshipped him." In Revelation 3:9, Christ declares, "Behold, I will make them of the synagogue of Satan, which say they are Jews, and are not, but do lie; behold, I will make them to come and worship before thy feet, and to know that I have loved thee." Mark 5:6 states, "But when he saw Jesus afar off, he ran and worshipped him," These passages show that Christ receives direct worship, yet He never rebukes or refuses it. If He were not God, He would have corrected those worshiping Him—as the angel did in Revelation.

Jesus is glorified alongside the Father, further proving His deity. Hebrews 13:20-21 states, "Now the God of peace, that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, Make you perfect in every good work to do his will, working in you that which is wellpleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen." Jude 1:25 affirms, "To the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen." John 11:4 declares, "When Jesus heard that, he said, This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby." Matthew 16:27 states, "For the Son of man shall come in the glory of his Father with his angels; and then he shall reward every man according to his works." Matthew 25:31 continues, "When the Son of man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory:" Revelation 15:3-4 states, "And they sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying, Great and marvellous are thy works, Lord God Almighty; just and true are thy ways, thou King of saints. Who shall not fear thee, O Lord, and glorify thy name? for thou only art holy: for all nations shall come and worship before thee; for thy judgments are made manifest."

God does not approve of worship of anything or anyone outside of Himself. "Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the LORD thy God *am* a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth

generation of them that hate me;" (Exodus 20:5). "Therefore thus saith the Lord GOD; Now will I bring again the captivity of Jacob, and have mercy upon the whole house of Israel, and will be jealous for my holy name;" (Ezekiel 39:25). The Scriptures are absolutely clear and without invitation to any private interpretation. The word of God is its own cross-reference. God is worshiped in the Old Testament at various locations and temples and worshiped in the New Testament in a body or tabernacle made without hands in the person of Jesus and testified of by the Holy Spirit. Two God-breathed testaments written in blood oaths and yoked inseparably with the complete law, testimony, hope, and love of His revelation to a lost creation. One God and one God alone, as Deuteronomy 4:39 states, "Know therefore this day, and consider *it* in thine heart, that the LORD he *is* God in heaven above, and upon the earth beneath: *there is* none else." God is worthy of our praise and honor, and He is to be glorified above all creation.

If Jesus is a created being and not God, then why didn't our Lord Jesus rebuke the people for worshiping Him when He knew the word of God better than anyone? Not once did He rebuke being worshiped—He only forbade it to be known until the Father wanted it to be made known of Him; Mark 5:43; "And he charged them straitly that no man should know it; and commanded that something should be given her to eat". Mark 7:36; "And he charged them that they should tell no man: but the more he charged them, so much the more a great deal they published it;" Mark 8:30; "And he charged them that they should tell no man of him." Luke 4:34-35: "Saving, Let us alone: what have we to do with thee, thou Jesus of Nazareth? art thou come to destroy us? I know thee who thou art; the Holy One of God. And Jesus rebuked him, saying, Hold thy peace, and come out of him. And when the devil had thrown him in the midst, he came out of him, and hurt him not." Luke 8:56 "And her parents were astonished: but he charged them that they should tell no man what was done." Luke 9:20-21; "He said unto them, But whom say ye that I am? Peter answering said, The Christ of God. And he straitly charged them, and commanded them to tell no man that thing;" John 2:23-25 "Now when he was in Jerusalem at the passover, in the feast day, many believed in his name, when they saw the miracles which he did. But Jesus did not commit himself unto them, because he knew all men, And needed not that any should testify of man: for he knew what was in man." In Jesus dwells the fullness of the Godhead bodily "When the ruler of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and knew not whence it was: (but the servants which drew the water knew;) the governor of the feast called the bridegroom," John 2:9. He is the express image of God. "Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high;" Hebrews 1:3. He is the power of God and the wisdom of God. "But unto them which are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God, and the

wisdom of God." 1 Corinthians 1:24. He is our life. "When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with him in glory." Colossians 3:4. God gives the light of the knowledge of the glory of God, and it shines from the face of Jesus Christ. "For God, who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." 2 Corinthians 4:6 He is the Lord of Glory. "Which none of the princes of this world knew: for had they known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory." 1 Corinthians 2:8.

The book of Acts reinforces this truth. Acts 12:21-23 records the account of Herod, who accepted worship and failed to glorify God: "And upon a set day Herod, arrayed in royal apparel, sat upon his throne, and made an oration unto them. And the people gave a shout, saying, It is the voice of a god, and not of a man. And immediately the angel of the Lord smote him, because he gave not God the glory: and he was eaten of worms, and gave up the ghost." If Jesus were merely "a god" as some claim, why does Scripture declare Him to be "Mighty God" (Isaiah 9:6) and affirm that there is only one God?" (Isaiah 43:10; 44:8) God does not share His glory with another (Isaiah 42:8), yet Christ is glorified alongside the Father (John 17:5,24). God commands all His angels to worship the Son (Hebrews 1:6), though He commands us to worship God alone (Matthew 4:10, Revelation 19:10; 22:9). If God does not share His throne (Isaiah 42:8), why does He share it with Jesus (Revelation 22:3)?

Final Conclusion: Worship Proves Christ's Deity Worship belongs exclusively to God. Angels refuse worship. God commands all angels to worship Jesus. Jesus receives worship without rebuke. Jesus shares divine glory with His Father.

Herefore, Jesus Christ is Yahweh, God Almighty, eternally worthy of all worship.

Section 7: Trust God—The Exclusive Call to Rely on the Almighty

The foundation of faith in Scripture is built upon absolute trust in God alone. The Word of God declares a curse upon those who trust in man, riches, or even their own heart, while blessing those who trust in the LORD alone. This section establishes the undeniable truth that faith and trust must be placed exclusively in the Almighty—and in Christ, who is revealed as the One worthy of this trust.

Trusting in Anything Other Than God Leads to Destruction:

- Jeremiah 17:5-7— "Thus saith the LORD; Cursed be the man that trusteth in man, and maketh flesh his arm, and whose heart departeth from the LORD. For he shall be like the heath in the desert, and shall not see when good cometh; but shall inhabit the parched places in the wilderness, in a salt land and not inhabited. Blessed is the man that trusteth in the LORD, and whose hope the LORD is."
- **Proverbs 29:25** "The fear of man bringeth a snare: but whoso putteth his trust in the LORD shall be safe."
- **Job 4:17-18** "Shall mortal man be more just than God? shall a man be more pure than his maker? Behold, he put no trust in his servants; and his angels he charged with folly:"
- **Proverbs 28:26** "He that trusteth in his own heart is a fool: but whoso walketh wisely, he shall be delivered."
- Isaiah 31:1 "Woe to them that go down to Egypt for help; and stay on horses, and trust in chariots, because they are many; and in horsemen, because they are very strong; but they look not unto the Holy One of Israel, neither seek the LORD!"

Apologetic Truth: Trust in man, riches, worldly power, or even angels leads to deception. God alone is the refuge and stronghold for all who seek Him.

2. The Call to Trust in Yahweh

- Scripture calls every generation to trust in the LORD alone:
 - Psalms 40:1-4 "To the chief Musician, A Psalm of David. I waited patiently for the LORD; and he inclined unto me, and heard my cry. He brought me up also out of an horrible pit, out of the miry clay, and set my feet upon a rock, and established my goings. And he hath put a new song in my mouth, even praise unto our God: many shall see it, and fear, and shall trust in the LORD. Blessed is that man that maketh the LORD his trust, and respecteth not the proud, nor such as turn aside to lies."
 - **Psalms 37:3-5** "Trust in the LORD, and do good; so shalt thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed. Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart. Commit thy way unto the LORD; trust also in him; and he shall bring it to pass."
 - **Psalms 115:9-11** "O Israel, trust thou in the LORD: he *is* their help and their shield. O house of Aaron, trust in the LORD: he *is* their help and their shield. Ye that fear the LORD, trust in the LORD: he *is* their help and their shield."

- **Proverbs 3:5-6** "Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths."
- Isaiah 26:4 "Trust ye in the LORD forever: for in the LORD JEHOVAH is everlasting strength."
- Apologetic Truth: The command to trust in Yahweh alone is absolute and non-negotiable—He alone is the rock and stronghold of salvation.
- 3. The Word of God Commands Us to Trust in the Son
- If we are commanded to trust only in Yahweh, yet Scripture declares that trust must be placed in Christ, then Christ must be Yahweh revealed:
 - Psalms 2:10-12 "Be wise now therefore, O ye kings: be instructed, ye judges
 of the earth. Serve the LORD with fear, and rejoice with trembling. Kiss the Son,
 lest he be angry, and ye perish from the way, when his wrath is kindled but a
 little. Blessed are all they that put their trust in him."
 - Romans 15:8-12 "Now I say that Jesus Christ was a minister of the circumcision for the truth of God, to confirm the promises *made* unto the fathers: And that the Gentiles might glorify God for *his* mercy; as it is written, For this cause I will confess to thee among the Gentiles, and sing unto thy name. And again he saith, Rejoice, ye Gentiles, with his people. And again, Praise the Lord, all ye Gentiles; and laud him, all ye people. And again, Esaias saith, There shall be a root of Jesse, and he that shall rise to reign over the Gentiles; in him shall the Gentiles trust."

. "

- Apologetic Truth: If trust is commanded for Yahweh alone, yet given to Christ, then Christ must be Yahweh made manifest.
- 4. The Son of God Declares His Sovereign Power Over Those Who Trust in Him
- Jesus Christ confirms that trusting in Him means trusting in the Father:
 - John 10:25-30 Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believed not: the
 works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me. But ye believe not,
 because ye are not of my sheep, as I said unto you. My sheep hear my voice,
 and I know them, and they follow me: And I give unto them eternal life; and they
 shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand. My Father,

which gave them me, is greater than all; and no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand. **I and my Father are one.**

Final Conclusion: The only one worthy of trust is God Almighty Himself—Jesus Christ is revealed as that One, commanding trust in His name, promising eternal life, and affirming His absolute unity with the Father.

Section 8: None Can Deliver Out of My Hand—The Absolute Sovereignty of Christ and the Father

Scripture declares the undisputed sovereignty of God—His authority over life, death, salvation, and judgment cannot be challenged or overridden by any power. This exclusive claim is made by Yahweh in the Old Testament, yet Jesus echoes the same divine declaration in the New Testament, proving His unity with the Father and His absolute authority as God.

- Yahweh Declares That None Can Deliver Out of His Hand:
 - Deuteronomy 32:39 "See now that I, even I, am He, and there is no god with me: I kill, and I make alive; I wound, and I heal: neither is there any that can deliver out of my hand."
 - Deuteronomy 32:40 "For I lift up my hand to heaven, and say, I live for ever."
- Apologetic Truth: Only Yahweh possesses the supreme authority over life and death—His sovereign power cannot be opposed.
- 2. Jesus Christ Declares the Same Sovereign Authority Over Life and Salvation
- **Mathematical Christ applies the same exclusive authority to Himself—proving His divine nature:**
 - John 10:28 "And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand."
 - John 10:29 "My Father, which gave *them* me, is greater than all; and no *man* is able to pluck *them* out of my Father's hand."
 - John 10:30 "I and my Father are one."
- Apologetic Truth: If Yahweh alone declares that none can be delivered from His hand, yet Jesus makes the same claim about Himself, then Jesus must be Yahweh revealed in flesh.

3. The Absolute Unity of Christ and the Father

The doctrine of God's exclusive sovereignty eliminates all possibility of plurality in salvation:

- Jesus does not say, "My Father gave them to another god."
- Jesus does not declare that the Father places believers under any authority but His own.
- Jesus affirms that His authority is the SAME as the Father's.

Final Conclusion: Only God can hold the souls of believers eternally secure—if Jesus shares this authority and none can be plucked from His hand, then Jesus is God Himself, the second person of the Godhead.

Section 9: The Ancient of Days and the Son of Man—The Divine Majesty of Christ

The prophetic visions of **Daniel and John** present an extraordinary **revelation of divine majesty**, highlighting the **Ancient of Days** seated upon His throne and the **Son of Man**, who comes in **glory and dominion**. The striking resemblance between these two visions **confirms the eternal nature and authority of Christ**, who is **revealed not as a created being but as the very manifestation of God Himself**.

Daniel's Vision of the Ancient of Days:

Daniel 7:9-10 – "I beheld till the thrones were cast down, and the Ancient of days did sit, whose garment was white as snow, and the hair of his head like the pure wool: his throne was like the fiery flame, and his wheels as burning fire. A fiery stream issued and came forth from before him: thousand thousands ministered unto him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him: the judgment was set, and the books were opened."

Apologetic Truth: The Ancient of Days is clearly identified as God Himself, seated in majesty and judgment, receiving the worship of countless heavenly beings.

2. Christ's Revelation Mirrors the Majesty of the Ancient of Days

John's Vision of Christ aligns perfectly with the attributes of the Ancient of Days:

• Revelation 1:12-18 – "And I turned to see the voice that spake with me. And being turned, I saw seven golden candlesticks; And in the midst of the seven

candlesticks *one* like unto the **Son of man**, clothed with a garment down to the foot, and girt about the paps with a golden girdle. His head and *his* hairs *were* white like wool, as white as snow; and his eyes *were* as a flame of fire; And his feet like unto fine brass, as if they burned in a furnace; and his voice as the sound of many waters. And he had in his right hand seven stars: and out of his mouth went a sharp twoedged sword: and his countenance *was* as the sun shineth in his strength. And when I saw him, I fell at his feet as dead. And he laid his right hand upon me, saying unto me, Fear not; I am the first and the last: I *am* he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death. Write the things which thou hast seen, and the things which are, and the things which shall be hereafter; The mystery of the seven stars which thou sawest in my right hand, and the seven golden candlesticks. The seven stars are the angels of the seven churches: and the seven candlesticks which thou sawest are the seven churches."

♦ Apologetic Truth: The Son of Man is described with the same attributes as the Ancient of Days, confirming that Christ shares in the eternal nature and majesty of God.

- 3. The Son of Man—Given Eternal Dominion Over All Creation
- Daniel's vision further affirms the divine authority of Christ:
 - Daniel 7:13-14 "I saw in the night visions, and, behold, one like the Son of man came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the Ancient of days, and they brought him near before him. And there was given him dominion, and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages, should serve him: his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom that which shall not be destroyed."
- Apologetic Truth: Christ is given absolute rulership over all nations, receiving eternal dominion—a position that only God Himself holds.
- 4. Dynamic Parallels Between Ezekiel's Vision and Christ's Majesty
- Ezekiel's vision of the Almighty parallels Christ's divine revelation:
 - Ezekiel 1:24 "And when they went, I heard the noise of their wings, like the noise of great waters, as the voice of the Almighty, the voice of speech, as the noise of an host: when they stood, they let down their wings."
 - Revelation 1:15 "And his feet like unto fine brass, as if they burned in a furnace; and his voice as the sound of many waters."

Final Conclusion: The Ancient of Days, the Son of Man, and the Almighty are not separate entities but one divine revelation of God Himself—fully unveiled in Jesus Christ, the eternal King, the sovereign Judge, and the Lord of glory.

Section 10: God Is Our Life—Christ as the Source of All Existence

Scripture confirms that God alone is the source of life, the giver of breath, and the sustainer of all creation. The Old Testament establishes Yahweh as the author of life, while the New Testament reveals Jesus Christ as the embodiment of life itself—the One who gives eternal life to whom He wills.

God Alone Gives Life and Sustains All Creation:

- **Genesis 2:7** "And **the LORD God formed man** *of* the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul."
